Introduction

The Home School Agreement is a document setting out the expectations School, parents and pupils have of each other. It sets the foundation for a strong reciprocal relationship between home and school. It is sent out as an online form each September.

The School

We shall do our utmost to:

- Provide a safe, secure and caring learning environment
- Ensure equal opportunity for all by embracing and valuing difference
- Ensure that safeguarding is at the heart of everything we do
- Provide a balanced and inclusive curriculum and the best possible education opportunities
- Provide a curriculum that meets the needs of children including building resilience, promoting well-being and mental health
- Promote our aims and objectives for teaching and learning within the school and live our values of Learn Reach Shine
- Set individual targets for each child and report on their progress each term
- Set and monitor your child's homework, schoolwork, homework diary
- Teach and encourage children to do their best and achieve their full potential as a valued member of the community
- Build strong relationships with children and families with a foundation of respect for all parties
- Install and promote positive values and a caring attitude towards the school community and environment within all students
- Keep you informed about general school issues and your child's progress by providing parents and carers with regular information including newsletters and meetings to discuss progress
- Keep you informed about what your child will learn in school
- Contact you if there is an issue with your child's behaviour, attendance, work or attitude and work with you to find positive ways to move forward
- Maintain a clear and consistent approach to managing behaviour through our Relational Behaviour Policy; building positive relationships between staff, pupils and parents based on respect and dialogue.
- Provide online safety education to our children and families so children are resilient and protected against online threats
- Provide a range of extra-curricular activities including afterschool and offsite visits
- Be welcoming and offer opportunities for parents/carers to be involved in school life
- Respond to any non-safeguarding enquiries within two school days.
- Have high expectations of parents and pupils, insisting that all discussions are respectful, not tolerating discrimination, aggression or threatening behaviour from any party

Parents/Guardians

I shall do everything in my power to:

- Ensure that my child attends school every day, on time and properly equipped
- Ensure my child is collected from school on time at the end of day and keep the school abreast of any changes to collection arrangements
- Take an interest in school life, be positive about school and encourage my child to take a full part in school life
- Ensure my children wears the correct school uniform with no extreme hairstyles or colours, no jewellery aside from 1 pair of discrete studs in the ears.
- Inform the school on the first day of any absence from school
- Provide the school with at least two reachable contact names so that my child can be collected quickly in the event of an emergency
- Communicate any concerns or problems which may affect my child's work, behaviour or wellbeing
- Work collaboratively with teachers to support my child's development to ensure a positive learning experience
- Support the school's relational behaviour and anti-bullying policies
- Approach the teachers and other staff, other parents and pupils in a respectful and non-threatening manner
- Support the school's code of conduct on the use of the internet and e-safety and work with my child at home to ensure and monitor safe use of technology and the internet, acting as a guide and role model
- Support the school's mobile phone policy and ensure that no child brings a smartphone or smartwatch to school
- Provide a suitable environment to enable my child to complete homework successfully and to support their home learning experience
- Attend parents' evenings and discussions about my child's progress
- Read and engage with school communications
- Recognise that the school is part of a wider community and remember the respect that we owe to all within our own, national and global communities

- Be proud of myself and my school and follow these expectations and know that if I
 don't, the school will follow the steps in the behaviour policy to keep me and those
 around me safe
- Learn to resolve difficulties in a positive, respectful way
- Respect and take pride in our environment and surroundings at all times, including extra-curricular activities
- Use technology sensibly following the rules set out in the Internet Code of Practice and be aware of keeping safe online at all times
